## Post Soviet education system

- 99,9 % of primary and secondary schools is state owned (secondary schools: 20.358 state, 218 private)
- Only state financing for state schools
- Private schools receive heavy tax regime; business
- No freedom of choice for parents
- No rights for NGO's and churches to establish schools
- Lack of fair competition in the education system
- · Lack of incentives for improvement quality of education





#### Reforms needed

- 1. To bring the system into line with European and international educational freedom standards
- 2. To remove a major source of conflict among religious and language groups through a pluralistic education system
- 3. To stimulate quality of education, bringing new energies to the educational system; the creation of a shared culture and mission in schools, and, over time, offering models of excellence
- 4. Ensure fairness; that requires public funding for parental choices, whether of public or private schools
- 5. To give parents the right to participate in the governance of schools
