Spain, regulation law

- The Spanish Constitution recognizes in its Article 27, the freedom of education:
- Right of parents to choose the religious and moral education of their children in accordance with his belief.
- Obligation and free cost of basic education.
- Freedom of establishment of educational institutions.
- Professors, parents and students intervene in the management of educational institutions supported with public funds.

1. Private schools under contract in Spain. Regulation law

- The centers under contract are educational centers promoted by the initiative of civil society and supported by public funds.
- For this purpose, these school institutions must sign with the Administration the educative contract.

2. Participation of centers under contract in Spanish education system

- The centers under contract enroll in Spain:
- 27.4% of pupils at all levels supported with public funds:
- 28% children from 3 to 6 years.
- 30% in primary (7 to 12 years)
- 32% in compulsory secondary education (13 to 16 years).



Effect of autonomous regions

- The differences between autonomous regions (17 in Spain), are important.
- In Madrid region or Navarre, centers under contract, enroll 35% of pupils.
- 31% in Catalonia and in La Rioja.
- The regions with fewer centers under contract are Andalusia (22%), Extremadura (19%) and Castile-La Mancha (15%).
- In practice, the right of parent's election is not the same throughout Spain and it represents an inequality between Spanish.

Another inequality

- According to the School Board of the State data: Spanish educational Administrations devote:
- 17% of its spending on primary and secondary education (excluding investments) in 27.4% of students studying in the contracted centers and
- 83% of its spending in 72.6% who do public schools.
- Three simple divisions lead to the conclusion that public expenditure per student of contracted centers is 46% lower of expenditure per student of publics schools. Municipalities do not pay the cleaning, maintenance and monitoring of contracted centers. Expenses which are at their charge in public schools.

Good Practices

- The Community of Madrid has undertaken a public distribution program of land for construction by private initiative.
- From 2004 to 2013- 2014 were built in the region of Madrid by these system 55 new centers with contract, 16 in Madrid Capital and 39 in the rest of the region.
- With further initiatives to improve the educational opportunities, the Madrid Region has switched all town to a unique area of schooling concessions centers.

A small step

- The recent Organic Law of Improving Educational Quality (LOMCE), 9 December 2013 refers:
- "The educative administrations may convene public calls for tenders for the builder and management centers on public land under contract intended to equipment"
- As you can see good ideas often succeed, but not everywhere.
