The Universal Declaration of human rights - 1948

cle 18

ryone has the right to <u>freedom</u> of thought, conscience and <u>religion;</u> tincludes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, eithe or in community with others and in public or private, <u>to manifest</u> and observance

cle 26.

<u>veryone has the right to education</u>. <u>Education</u> shall be <u>free</u>, at least elementary and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be pulsory. (...)

Education shall be directed to the full development of the human sonality and to the strengthening of respect for human rights and damental freedoms. (...)

Parents have a prior right to choose the kind of education that shall not be noted to their children.

There is a good deal of evidence, based on scientific research, to emphasize the pedagogical need of a strong primary culture as a foundation from which children can develop into autonomous adults (De Ruyter and Miedema, 2000)

Based on these juridical and pedagogical arguments we want to support the statement of freedom of choice.
