Characteristics of the educational market

An educational market is characterized by the coexistence

of public and private schools

at the same conditions.

In a competitive market

schools must improve their quality to attract students

The social capital embedded in denominational schools

increases the learning outcomes



Differences in achievement

In PISA tests, students perform much better in some countries

For well known traditional reasons:

- differences in students' background (social, cultural, economic)
- system differences (teachers quality, amount of resources)

But recent research found two more elements:

- institutional setting
- the "dark matter": character skills



The institutional setting

The organization model changes from a *centralized State school system*

to

a network of autonomous schools financed by the State competing to attract students with high quality education

Parents are free to choose the school they think would be the better for different reasons:

religious identity, cultural program, composition

Freedom of choice is an

Essential requirement

for an effective school system

Character skills

For an effective schooling in innovative societies learning outcomes must fit the needs of 21st century Cognitive skills are important, but not sufficient Non cognitive and transversal skills are required

for a personal global development

To cope with the changes in labor market
the diverse dimensions of character skills
are interconnected

they constitute the WHOLE CHILD

Education for the person

Character skills are not fixed traits of personality
an effective education could enhance them
and produce an incremental development of the "Big Five"
In a creative process

This is a big challenge for free schools
